All-Purpose cieaners

All-purpose cleaners start losing their effectiveness after two years. While they may still clean, they won't be as efficient in cutting through grime and dirt as they were when first purchased.





Antibacterial Cleaners

Antibacterial cleaners have a shelf life of about one year. However, if the product is diluted or exposed to extreme temperatures, its effectiveness may be compromised sooner, reducing its ability to kill bacteria.

Powdered Cleaning Products

Powdered cleaning products, especially those used by carpet cleaning technicians, tend to have a longer shelf life than their liquid counterparts. Their effectiveness remains intact over extended periods, making them a reliable choice for long-term use.





Laundry Detergent Unopened laundry detergent begins to degrade after about nine months.

Once opened, its shelf life is reduced to six months, after which it may not clean clothes as effectively as before.

Cleaner Window cleaners generally remain effective for about two years. After this period, their ability to clean glass


